Autumn marks the start of a busy harvest season for the Food Team. Throughout September and October, Urban Outreach staff went into **37** schools and **5** churches across Bolton delivering harvest messages and saying thank you for all their generous donations.

All of the donated food is used to make up food parcels for Storehouse Foodbank and Pantries. These then go out each week to help people who are in need across Bolton. The large amount of food that comes in at harvest sustains these projects throughout the year so it has been amazing to see these donations pour in.

Through the generosity of so many across Bolton,

12.3 TONNES

of food was donated over the harvest period!

Thank you so much to all of the schools, churches, businesses and individuals that have given over this harvest season. It is only with your help that we can continue supporting people across Bolton with food parcels.

Over the last quarter alone (July to Sept),

Street Life has had 60 new households
approach for support, made up of 83
individuals, including men, women and
children. These people will be offered support
with housing related issues such as eviction
advice and support.

All the while people will be welcome to attend the **Street Life** drop-in each week to check for housing updates and for help with various housing related needs like registering with Homes for Bolton, getting the correct documents for a prospective landlord, sourcing ID etc.

Since July 2025 Reach
Out have worked with
11 women who are
involved in sex work,
offering harm
reduction, referrals to
services like Achieve for
drug and alcohol
support, guidance
around staying safe,
finances and more.

A man attended the Street Life Drop-in with a friend supporting him. The friend explained that this man had autism and learning differences and due to not keeping up with previous rent payments, had been left sleeping rough.

Street Life made contact with all the relevant housing providers to see if they had any homes available and started looking for private rents for him. Over the next few months Street Life tried hard to find accommodation but unfortunately non were suitable as he only wanted one locality.

Street Life worked hard negotiating with Housing Options and managed to gain High Needs Plus on his Homes for Bolton registration.

A month later a property in the right area became available for him, which was near his friend who is happy to continue to support him.

He did not have photo ID or a birth certificate so Street Life was able to support him to get these and he moved into the property. Street Life was also able to support him to get white goods.

We celebrate this great news with him!

Reaching Inside, Strengthening Emotions

This Autumn we hosted a series of Emotional Health Group sessions through September and October.

5 new young people attended.
6 new parents/carers were engaged with.

RISE overall supported **47** young people and **49** parents throughout July to September.

"On a positive; "B" has been raring to go into year 7.
Your programme worked wonders for him. He's a different lad. Thank you." - From a parent whose child engaged with our Next Chapter Project.

NEXT

Our school transition project, Next Chapter, offers group and 1-1 support for those needing emotional health guidance moving from primary to secondary school to encourage positive and resilient mindsets. Currently we have connected with 22 children aged 10 and 11

years.

Our Re-Root, reduction in Youth Violence, project has involved **35** young people on the programme at present aged 11-17. We are launching class/year/assembly presentations alongside virtual reality modules on Knife Crime, County Lines, Self Harm, Grooming, Cyber Bullying and Sexual Exploitation.
